St. Martin's is also a Dekalb County Polling Precinct.

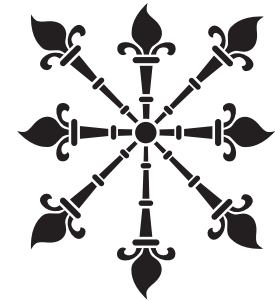
