Dear Friends,

Do you ever get the feeling that May seems busier than Christmas? Perhaps this is due to the large number of activities that happen at the end of the school year. Lately it seems that every group I am involved with has an end of year party, celebration, or concert. While I know it is easy to complain about these various activities, I am convinced that they also give us the chance to celebrate the things that give our life meaning as a Christian Community.

This past spring, our church's men's Bible study has been reading our way through the Gospel of St. John. Jesus' first miracle in the gospel occurs at a wedding in Cana of Galilee. I am pleased that this church's choir can be with us for this special celebration on their very first tour of North America. Mark your calendar and don't miss this special evening with the choir of our mother church.

Our second special event will be our annual parish retreat at Kanuga on the weekend of June 24-26. We had to do a little rescheduling this year to accommodate the St. Martin's Choir visit and anniversary concert. However, I know that some folks have not been able to attend this weekend in the past because it conflicted with Mother's Day obligations. It has always been a special weekend for our family in a lovely setting in the mountains of North Carolina. PARISH POST DELIVERY CHANGES

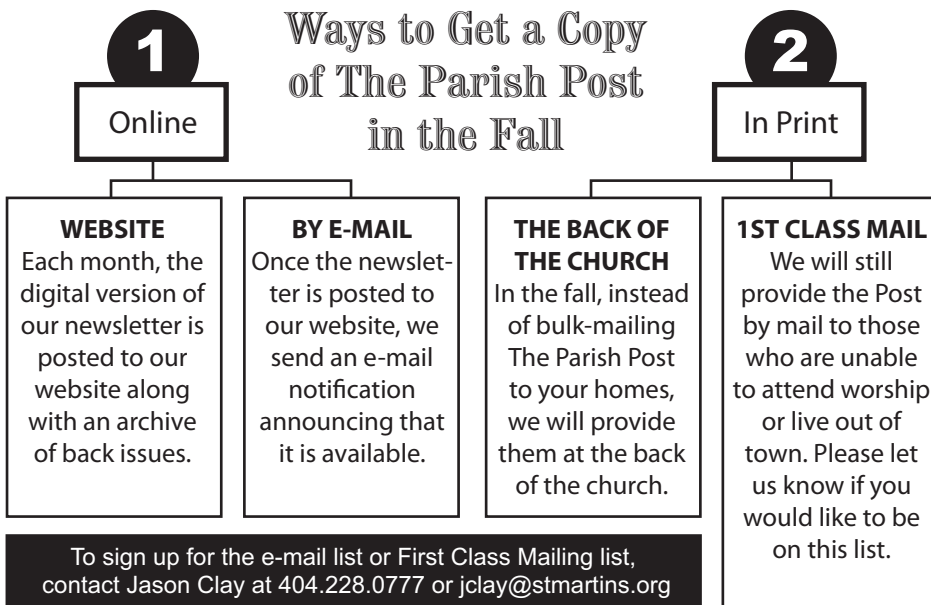

Beginning in the fall, we are making a change to the delivery of our printed newsletter, *The Parish Post*. Instead of mailing it, we will provide the newsletter at the back of the church the weekend before the month starts. For instance, the September edition will be available the last weekend of August.

Currently, we are using a bulk mail service that takes about two weeks to deliver the *Post*. Unfortunately, this pushes the deadline for the *Post* back by two weeks, which means the content of the newsletter is not as fresh as it could be by the time it arrives in your mailboxes. Not to mention, this in an expense we can eliminate.

With the savings, we intend to send a limited number of *Posts* by First Class Mail, which delivers in a more timely fashion, to those that are unable to attend worship, or live out of town.

The Post will still be available in its online format through the monthly e-mail notification and the website (which conveniently include several years' worth of back issues).

According to the chronology table in the NIV Bible, Abram took his wife Sarai and departed for a distant and unknown land shortly after 2100 BCE. He left at the command of the Lord that he leave his country, his people and his father's house and go to a land the Lord would show him. The Lord promised Abram the following:

*"I will make you into a great nation,
 And I will bless you.
 I will make your name great,
 and you will be a blessing.
 I will bless those who bless you,
 and whoever curses you I will curse,
 and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."*

This act of incredible faith began a series of equally unlikely events.

- At age ninety-nine Abram was visited by the Lord who told him he would become the father of many nations

Jesus is risen. Alleluia!

ACTS OF PERSONAL PIETY

I am always fascinated by the various acts of personal piety one observes in an Episcopal congregation. The thing that pleases me the most, however, is the great diversity of outward religious expression. Some people find these customs very meaningful, and some don't, and it's okay either way!

Bowing in the direction of the altar cross or, "Christus Rex" in the case of St. Martin's, is a simple outward act of respect for the cross of Christ. Making the "sign of the cross" when one begins and ends prayer, at the conclusion of the creed, at the absolution, and before receiving Holy Communion, is something many of us do; not to be seen by others, but to remind ourselves that we belong to Christ and that the cross is "our sign".

These acts of personal piety are sacraments. They are outward and visible signs of inward spiritual beliefs and aspirations. What I appreciate so much about our church is that in any given worship gathering there will be a variety of worship customs expressed, and yet a unity in worship that is found in the incredible richness of our Book of Common Prayer.

Another "advantage" of these acts of piety is that they remind us that, as a liturgical church, our role is that of participants, not spectators or attendees. The priest at the altar is not doing something for the laity in the pews, not moving and working on behalf of the congregation, but instead leading, and conducting an act that requires a community. "Liturgy", from the Greek leitourgia, means "the work of the people". All of the assembled community of faith, priest and lay person alike, are called to participate in offering worship. Our collective, outward, acts of piety are powerful reminders of our active role as participants in the holy activity of worship. Standing, sitting, kneeling, singing, speaking the responses in the liturgy, and exchanging the Peace, are sacraments which enrich our common life and I'm glad we have them!

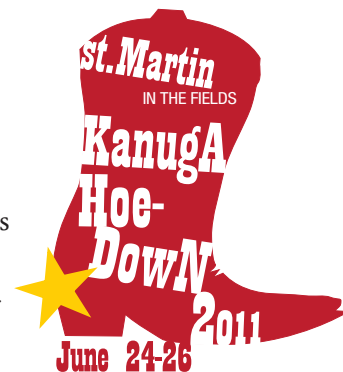
