

Vestry Elections: A message from Vince Vitti, Senior Warden

Last year the Interim Rector and Vestry called a special meeting with the Parish to discuss the possibility of freezing the 2018 vestry elections to maintain institutional knowledge among its members so that they could finish the rector search process and adequately onboard a new rector. In addition to freezing elections, the Parish was also asked to allow the number of elected Vestry members to be reduced from 15 to 12. The motion was passed, and now it is time to begin the election process to select four new vestry members for 2020!

According to our bylaws, the nominating committee, which consists of outgoing Vestry members and two at large parishioners, shall notify the Parish of its request for nominations at least two weeks before the first meeting. This is notification.

Our timeline for the election process is as follows:

- Sundays, October 6 and October 13 - Collect names and contact interested candidates.
- Sundays, October 20 and October 27 - Publish candidate slate in the bulletin and e-newsletter.
- Sundays, November 3, November 10, and November 17 - Hold elections.
- Sunday, December 1 - Announce new Vestry members.
